High Light Plants

Examples: Fiddle Leaf Fig, Bird of Paradise, Succulents, Alocasia

Care Tips:

- **Light Requirements:** High light plants thrive in bright, indirect sunlight for 6-8 hours daily. Direct sunlight can scorch the leaves, so it's important to provide filtered light if placing them near a window.
- **Watering Schedules:** These plants generally prefer the soil to dry out slightly between waterings. For succulents, water deeply but infrequently, allowing the soil to dry out completely between waterings.
- **Common Issues:** Leaf burn, leggy growth, and wilting can occur if the light is too intense or insufficient. Ensure that high light plants are not exposed to drafts or sudden temperature changes.

Low Light Plants

Examples: Snake Plant, ZZ Plant, Pothos, Dracaena

Care Tips:

- **Light Requirements:** Low light plants can tolerate low to medium indirect light. They should be kept away from direct sunlight to prevent leaf burn.
- **Watering Schedules:** These plants generally need less frequent watering. Overwatering is a common issue; make sure the soil dries out between waterings.
- **Ideal Placement:** Perfect for offices, bathrooms, and spaces with minimal natural light. Rotate plants periodically to ensure even growth.
