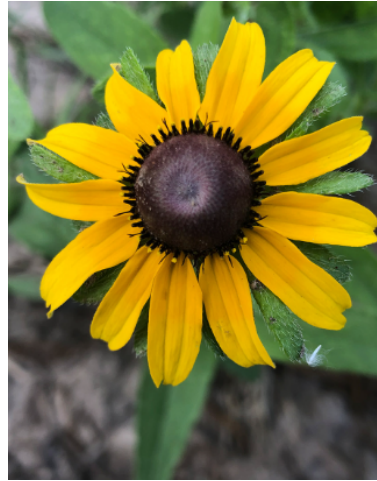

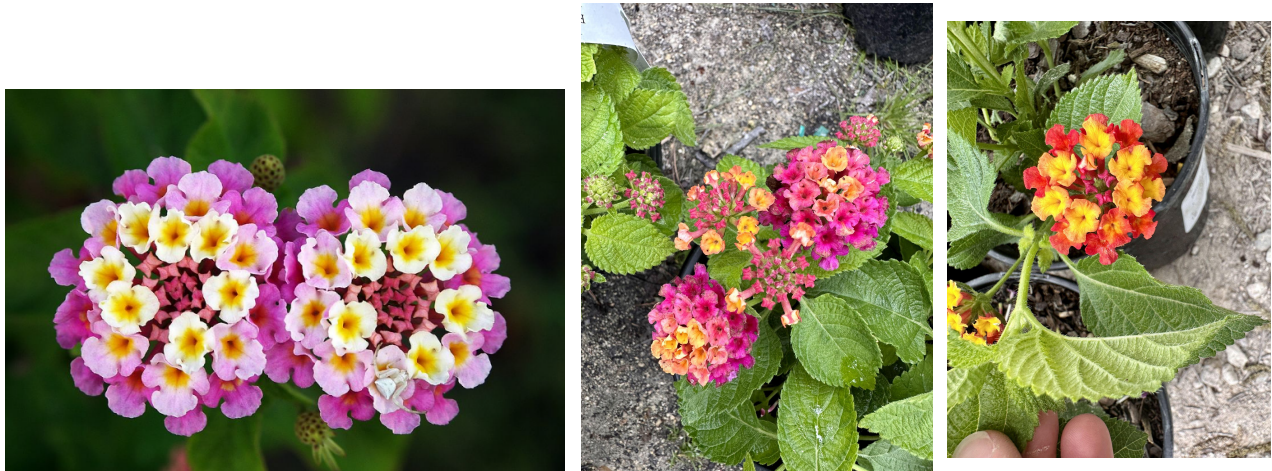
drought-tolerant and can adapt to various soil conditions, making them versatile for different garden settings.
